**NHYA update from Danielle Strater:** 

Items found in the shed at Knowles Field were hot dog cooker, 2 refrigerators and a steamer, all of which could be available for a future fundraiser.

5800.00 will be needed for a new irrigation system and applications for donations will be sought.

Soccer registrations closed last weekend. 50 kids in pre-K through grade have registered so far with a travel team as well for the older kids. M and Y and Donut Love have sponsored the younger children.

Summer program re-cap:

Joe expressed that he would like to see more resident participation as only 50% of the teams were from North Hampton. There were 79 people from 5 towns who were part of the coed program. Danielle suggested that NHYA could have a table at baseball in the spring to inform and recruit potential players from town.

Old Home Day review:

It was felt that the day was well attended although at school attendance dropped off by 11:30 The dunk tank was a big hit. The ice cream truck had challenges becoming operational and Betty's Kitchen food truck reported disappointing revenue. Danielle was thanked for her outstanding face painting job. The cookie bake off had 7 entries and was well received. Wally made a suggestion that the day be moved to June the weekend after school recesses to increase attendance. Also, Dearborn Park may be a better location for most of the activities. Parking is a concern. Including Centennial Hall in more activities was also discussed.
