


**Incorporated: 1742**

**Origin:** First settled in 1639, this town was a part of Hampton known as North Hill Parish. Residents began petitioning for a separate parish as early as 1719. North Hill Parish was set off from Hampton in 1738, with the responsibility of supporting a clergyman and schoolmaster of their own. Full township privileges were not granted until 1742, following the establishment of the New Hampshire-Massachusetts border. North Hampton was the birthplace of General Henry Dearborn, commander-in-chief of the American forces in the War of 1812, for whom Fort Dearborn (now Chicago) and Dearborn, Michigan, were named.

**Population, Year of the First Census Taken:** 657 residents in 1790



**Population Trends:** Population change for North Hampton totaled 2,418 over 53 years, from 1,910 in 1960 to 4,328 in 2013. The largest decennial percent change was a 71 percent increase between 1960 and 1970. The 2013 Census estimate for North Hampton was 4,328 residents, which ranked 84th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

**Population Density and Land Area, 2013 (US Census Bureau):** 310.7 persons per square mile of land area. North Hampton contains 13.9 square miles of land area and 0.01 square miles of inland water area.
