### TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT JANUARY 23, 2023 SELECT BOARD MEETING

#### REPORTING PERIOD

The reporting period is from January 9, 2023 through January 20, 2023

#### **Finance**

Financially we are running at 45% of the budget remaining with 24 weeks remaining in the fiscal year.

#### Police

The Department's newest officer, Dylan Spence, has started and will be attending the Police Academy for 16 weeks beginning February 27<sup>th</sup>.

The Department also brought in an intern from Great Bay College. He will be assisting with digitizing records, other assignments and learning about what life as a police officer entails.

#### Fire

Chief Lajoie applied for and received notification of a grant award in the amount of \$7,500.00 from the State of NH HSEM. As a result, he'll be working with RPC to update the town's Hazard Mitigation Plan, which requires updating every five years.

#### **Facilities**

Town Hall. The boiler in the Town Hall and Stone Building have been changed over to natural gas, Generators are scheduled to be completed in the next two weeks.

New Town Office/Fire/Police Buildings. There is an item on the agenda for a project update.

Stone Building. Nothing new to report. The heating system has been changed to natural gas.

Town Office/Chevalier Building. The building has been demolished, no further updates will be required.

#### Recreation

Recreation had a very well attended senior luncheon this past Tuesday and have planned the return of "Coffee with seniors" on Friday January 27<sup>t</sup> at the new town office. The next luncheon is planned for Tuesday February 21<sup>st</sup> at the REC.

Winterfest, scheduled for February 25<sup>th</sup>, will include a pancake breakfast at the REC, winter carnival games, a 3 V 3 basketball tournament, dodgeball, bingo, ice skating and broom ball, a chili cook-off contest between North Hampton Fire and Police, open mike, sledding, snowman making, human bobsled race, and will culminate with a bonfire and food at Dearborn Park.

New youth programs include floor hockey at the REC, and game night at the REC featuring "Madden" play.

Our next grades 3,4,5 dance is scheduled for Saturday January  $28^{th}$ , and our next Parent Night Out is scheduled for Friday February  $10^{th}$ .

Summer plans continue to progress, we expect summer camp registrations to begin on February 15<sup>th</sup>. We have also added a summer soccer camp with Seacoast United to our summer schedule.

#### Highway

The Highway Department has been busy with storms as well as ongoing winter maintenance. After each storm equipment is cleaned and if needed repaired. In addition salt and sand storage is stocked and blended for the next storm.

The Department is also staffing and processing materials at the Recycling Center while we are down employees at that location.

#### **Projects**

Route 1 Culvert. Flooding is still an issue with properties on North Road. I have been checking the culvert and reporting to District 6 when it requires cleaning.

*PFAS Investigation.* The project has passed the environmental review by DES and I hope to have final approval to move forward by the end of January.

Revaluation. Nothing new to report. MRI has begun the process and we expect to be completed this spring.

Cell Tower. There is an item on the agenda for a public hearing.

Walkway Project. Nothing new to report. This project will be completed after the buildings have been constructed. This alleviates the chance of damage during construction.

Coakley Landfill Group. Nothing new to report. The meeting scheduled for scheduled for January 5<sup>th</sup> was cancelled and rescheduled for February 15th. I plan to be in attendance.

Junkyard Closures and/or New Problems: Nothing new to report.

Rails to Trails. A warrant article was recommended by both the Select Board and Budget Committee for expenses that may arise in the next budget year on the rail trail

Seacoast Private Well Initiative. The well testing seminar was held at Exeter High School. Residents were educated on common contaminants and received test kits which they will return to the Town Office for testing. Return dates for North Hampton are January 24<sup>th</sup> and February 5<sup>th</sup>. Residents will then see results from the lab in 4 to 6 weeks. This was made possible by grant funding and is approximately a \$400 value to each household.

Route 95 Exit 2 Bridge. I received confirmation that this project has been delayed until after the winter season.

Meeting Schedule: The board's next meeting is scheduled for February 13th.

#### 1. Call to Order by the Chair

Chair Sununu called the meeting to order at 4:22PM. In attendance was Selectman Maggiore, and participating electronically Selectman Pinette.

Motion by Selectman Maggiore to allow Selectman Pinette to participate in the meeting electronically. Seconded by Chair Sununu. Motion carries 2-0.

### 2. New Business

2.1 Discussion of Warrant Articles

Town Administrator Tully reviewed the proposed FY2024 warrant articles:

#### FY 2024 Operating Budget

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate through taxation as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, Eight Million Nine Hundred Eighty Thousand One Hundred One Dollars (\$8,980,101)? Should this Article be defeated, the default budget shall be Eight Million Six Hundred Eighty Thousand Three Hundred Eighty-six Dollars (\$8,680,386), which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town or by law, or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only.

Recommended by the Select Board: 3-0 Recommended by the Budget Committee: 9-0

Article One:

Establish Communications Facility Road Access Capital Reserve Fund

To see if the Town will vote to establish a Communications Facility Road Access Capital Reserve Fund under the provisions of RSA 35:1 for the design, permitting and construction of an access road to Town owned land identified as Map 12, Lot 62, donated to the Town for a wireless telecommunications facility site, and to raise and appropriate through taxation the sum of Fifty-five Thousand Dollars (\$55,000) for deposit into the Fund, and to name the Select Board as agents to expend from the Fund?

Motion by Selectman Maggiore to recommend Article Two be placed on the warrant. Seconded by Selectman Pinette. Roll call: Sununu, aye; Maggiore, aye; Pinette, aye.

Article Three: Replace Fire & Rescue Command Vehicle

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) for the purpose of purchasing and equipping a command vehicle for the Fire & Rescue Department to replace the temporarily repurposed former police cruiser with said funds to come from the Fire Department Equipment and Apparatus Special Revenue Fund? This item has been identified in the approved Capital Improvements Plan. Approval of this Article will have no effect on the tax rate.

Motion by Selectman Pinette to recommend Article Three be placed on the warrant. Seconded by Selectman Maggiore. Roll call: Sununu, aye; Maggiore, aye; Pinette, aye.

Article Four: Purchase of a Police Cruiser

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate through taxation the sum of Fifty-five Thousand Dollars (\$55,000) for the purpose of purchasing and equipping a cruiser for the Police Department? This item has been identified in the approved Capital Improvements Plan.

Motion by Selectman Maggiore to recommend Article Four be placed on the warrant. Seconded by Selectman Pinette. Roll call: Sununu, aye; Maggiore, aye; Pinette, aye.

Article Five: Refurbish Fire & Rescue Engine 1

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) for the purpose of refurbishing and updating outdated equipment on the Fire & Rescue Department's 10-year-old fire engine with said funds to come from the Fire Department Equipment and Apparatus Special Revenue Fund? This item has been identified in the approved Capital Improvements Plan. Approval of this Article will have no effect on the tax rate.

Motion by Selectman Pinette to recommend Article Five be placed on the warrant. Seconded by Selectman Maggiore. Roll call: Sununu, aye; Maggiore, aye; Pinette, aye.

Article Six: Lease/Purchase of Public Works Medium Duty Dump Truck

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to enter into a five-year lease/purchase agreement in the amount of One Hundred Seven Thousand Dollars (\$107,000) for the purpose of leasing and equipping a medium duty dump truck for the Department of Public Works; and to raise and appropriate through taxation the sum of Twenty-one Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$21,400) for the first year's payment on said lease? This lease agreement contains a fiscal funding (escape) clause. This item has been identified in the approved Capital Improvements Plan.

Motion by Selectman Maggiore to amend Article Six to state to raise and appropriate and delete enter into a five-year lease/purchase agreement, and to state for the purpose of purchasing, and to delete leasing. Seconded by Selectman Pinette. Roll call: Sununu, aye; Maggiore, aye; Pinette, aye.

Article Seven: Road Resurfacing

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Eighty-five Thousand Dollars (\$285,000) for the purpose of resurfacing and reconstructing approximately three miles of road, by withdrawing Thirty

Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) from the previously established Municipal Transportation Improvement Capital Reserve Fund created for this purpose, and raising through taxation the sum of Two Hundred Fifty-five Thousand Dollars (\$255,000)? This item has been identified in the approved Capital Improvements Plan.

Motion by Selectman Pinette to recommend Article Seven be placed on the warrant. Seconded by Selectman Maggiore. Roll call: Sununu, aye; Maggiore, aye; Pinette, aye.

Article Eight: Philbrick Pond Marsh Restoration

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate through taxation the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) for the purpose of restoring health to the Philbrick Pond marsh? This item has been identified in the approved Capital Improvements Plan.

Motion by Selectman Maggiore to recommend Article Eight be placed on the warrant. Seconded by Selectman Pinette. Roll call: Sununu, aye; Maggiore, aye; Pinette, aye.

#### Article Nine: Rail Trail Equipment and Capital Improvements

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate through taxation the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) for the purpose of purchasing equipment and making capital improvements related to the rail trail? This item has been identified in the approved Capital Improvements Plan.

Motion by Selectman Maggiore to recommend Article Nine be placed on the warrant. Seconded by Selectman Pinette. Roll call: Sununu, aye; Maggiore, aye; Pinette, aye.

#### Article Ten: Contribution to the Coakley Landfill Capital Reserve Fund

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate through taxation the sum of Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) for deposit into the Coakley Landfill Capital Reserve Fund? The purpose of this fund is to account for expenses incurred by the Town under the Superfund Cleanup Program. The balance in the Fund, as of December 31, 2022, is \$264,331.

Motion by Selectman Pinette to recommend Article Ten be placed on the warrant. Seconded by Selectman Pinette. Roll call: Sununu, aye; Maggiore, aye; Pinette, aye.

#### Article Eleven:

#### Contribution to the Earned Time Settlement Capital Reserve Fund

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate through taxation the sum of Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) for deposit into the Earned Time Settlement Capital Reserve Fund? The purpose of this fund is to buy out employees earned time during anytime of the life of their career and limit the Town's unfunded accrued leave liability. The total liability for unfunded accrued leave is estimated to be \$370,762 of which \$143,587 may be payable prior to July 1, 2024. The balance in the Fund, as of December 31, 2022, is \$63,883.

Motion by Selectman Maggiore to recommend Article Eleven be placed on the warrant. Seconded by Selectman Pinette. Roll call: Sununu, aye; Maggiore, aye; Pinette, aye.

#### Article Twelve: Contribution to the Town Revaluation Capital Reserve Fund

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate through taxation the sum of Fourteen Thousand Dollars (\$14,000) for deposit into the Town Revaluation Capital Reserve Fund? The purpose of this fund is to allow for funding to comply with the State of New Hampshire's requirement to perform a property revaluation every five years. The balance in the Fund, as of December 31, 2022, is \$56,612.

Motion by Selectman Maggiore to recommend Article Twelve be placed on the warrant. Seconded by Selectman Pinette. Roll call: Sununu, aye; Maggiore, aye; Pinette, aye.
