Mr. Apple said I was alleging a criminal act, and he wanted to go into a non-public meeting under RSA 91. This is not a criminal offense and the town administrator is free to explain his actions in a public meeting. The Select Board has approved and promoted these actions for some time, resulting in the destruction of the Lamprey Conservation Property.

The defiance of Attorney General's Fosters opinion to investigate an issue brought to the attention of a board, and it's support of the town administrator violating the New Hampshire Constitution, demonstrates the board's involvement in these violations.

The meeting was called to order at 7:04 p.m. The agenda was posted in compliance with RSA 91A requirements.

Roll Call:

Attendance included Lisa Wilson (Chair), Kathy Grant (Co-Chair), Shep Kroner, Philip Thayer, and Andrew Vorkink. Also in attendance: Mr. Lauri Etela and Mr. Mike Lynch.

Approval of April 11, 2017 Draft Minutes:

After some discussion, a motion was made by Kathy Grant, duly seconded by Andrew Vorkink, to accept the minutes as presented, with one correction (the spelling of Deborah Goard's name). The motion carried with a unanimous vote.

New Business:

Letters of Request for Consideration for Nomination to Serve on Conservation Commission: The Chair introduced Mr. Lauri Etela and Mr. Mike Lynch, who have expressed interest in membership on the Commission. They both spoke briefly on why they would like to serve and were asked questions from Commission Members. After some discussion, a motion was made by Lisa Wilson, duly seconded by Kathy Grant, to recommend to the Select Board Mr. Lauri Etela for a three year term, expiring in 2020. The motion carried with a unanimous vote.

A motion was then made by Lisa Wilson, duly seconded by Kathy Grant, to recommend to the Select Board Mr. Mike Lynch for a one year term, expiring in 2018. The motion carried with a unanimous vote.

FB Environmental Associates Contract to conduct Winnicut River Water Quality Monitoring: There was discussion regarding the proposed contract to conduct water quality monitoring in the Winnicut River. The Commission expressed the need to contact the NH Rivers Council and possibly the NH Conservation Law Foundation to determine where the organizations are conducting water quality tests to avoid duplication of testing and unnecessary expense. After some discussion, a motion was made by Shep Kroner, duly seconded by Philip Thayer, to continue the discussion of the proposed Contract by FB Environmental Associates contract for water quality testing until the June 13th meeting. The motion carried with a unanimous vote.

FB Environmental Associates Correspondence dated April 12, 2017: Ideas for the 319 Grant Proposals to improve water quality within the Little River Watershed were

discussed which included exploring. a septic system pump out regulation, culvert work, and water quality testing. After some discussion, a motion was made by Andrew Vorkink, duly seconded by Shep Kroner, to authorize the Chair to compose a letter to the Select Board to contact the Hampton Select Board concerning water quality issues between Hampton and North Hampton. The motion carried with a unanimous vote.

Old Business:

Draft of Forest Hills Management Plan: Kathy Grant accompanied Kevin Ryan of FB Environmental Associates for two hours during his field work on April 27 and observed Mr. Ryan's professional and expert analysis of the land.

Conservation Easement Subcommittee Update: Andrew Vorkink gave an update and reported two complaints received regarding the Lamprey Conservation Easement: the complaint alleged that a septic system was improperly installed and questioned whether it was designed for animal waste or human waste. Upon investigation by the DES, a letter was sent a letter to the complainants and the Select Board to report that there was no violation of the easement.

The Commission discussed procedures for reporting complaints and recording documents by digitally and in hard copy.

Sign Design & Installation for Acknowledgement of Eagle Scout Projects: The Chair researched 6x9 aluminum signs with a cost of under \$50. Kathy Grant suggested a 4x4 sign on a post that she had seen that looked very nice. Philip Thayer and Kathy Grant will do more research and provide information at June 13th meeting.

Correspondence: The Chair announced: "Help Aquarion Water Company Find New Hampshire's Environmental Champions, The 2017 Aquarion Water Environmental Champion Awards." The Community is invited to nominate an adult, student, business or non-profit organization. Nomination deadline is May 24, 2017. Visit aquarionwater.com

Other Business:

Andrew Vorkink requested that the Chair contact the Select Board to inquire about the status of the 20 Chapel Road conservation parcel and whether or not the Select board received any correspondence from Little Boar's Head Village District.

These minutes were prepared as a reasonable summary of the essential content of this meeting, not as a transcription.

Chair Maggiore call the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Those in attendance were Selectman Miller, Selectwoman Kilgore and Town Administrator Apple.

Chair Maggiore led the Pledge of Allegiance.

No questions or comments from the public.

1. Call To Orderfor the Public Session

Public Comment is an opportunity for residents to ask questions, request information and make comments on issues facing the Town. Individuals will be given not more than three (3) minutes to speak, and people who have already spoken will be asked to wait until everyone has had the chance to speak once. The total time devoted to this agenda item is fifteen (15) minutes. Individuals who are not able to speak during the First Public Comment Session will be given first

opportunity to speak during the Second Public Comment Session at the end of the Meeting.

4.5 Timber Cut – Yield Tax Warrant

Motion by Selectwoman Kilgore to accept the Consent Calendar as presented. Seconded by Selectman Miller. Motion carries 3-0.

5. Correspondence

- 5.3 Correspondence relative to the DES approval of Aquarion's New Well #22

Chair Maggiore read three correspondence items into the record that are attached to these minutes.

Town Administrator Apple stated for those interested in reading the Aquarion Well #22 information; it is on the town's website under the Water Commission page, Select Board page and the Planning and Zoning page.

Town Administrator Apple stated he had received a letter during the reporting period from resident Catherine LaCroix asking questions about zoning restrictions on the price of a house and why are houses expensive in North Hampton and how that ties that in with the deduction of school age population that is happening in North Hampton.

Town Administrator Apple stated he responded back to Mrs. LaCroix and she in turn thanked him for his prompt response. He further asked the Select Board if they would like to comment any further.

Chair Maggiore invited Mrs. LaCroix to the podium.

Mrs. LaCroix asked if anything will be done to address the lack of affordable housing in North Hampton. She further stated in "talking with other families the taxes are fine"; however, there are no homes within the \$300,000 to \$500,000 range for families just starting out.

Selectman Miller stated there is not a simple answer to the question. He further stated 2/3 of the town is in wetlands or close enough to mitigate large-scale development and the town does not have sewage treatment.

Chair Maggiore state it is not a simple question, and one board or committee will not be able to provide the answer but would like to work for ways to make North Hampton attractive to families of all ages so it can be a destination.

Selectwoman Kilgore stated she did not know what the answer was either but when she moved to North Hampton from Rye her children were small. She further stated her son that has graduated from college and he is looking to eventually trying to settle in North Hampton. She stated that while she did not know what the answer is, if boards start talking and everyone grows to understand each other the town might get someplace as she feels the town hasn't had a discussion in years.

6. Committee Updates

Chair Maggiore updated the board with a letter received on May 4, 2017 from the Clerk of the Water Council that states in accordance with ENVWC 203.03 the council may vote to accept or dismiss the appeal or take other appropriate action at its next regular business meeting currently scheduled for May 10, 2017. He further stated if the council accepts the appeal a pre hearing conference will be scheduled and the town will be notified.

Chair Maggiore stated the Long Range Planning Committee has put out a town survey and it is available online and in hard copy at the town office and library.

The board discussed sending out a postcard informing residents of the survey.

Motion by Selectwoman Kilgore to approve the expenditure to create a mailer and mail to each resident in North Hampton asking them to participate in the Long Range Planning Committee's survey on the town. Seconded by Selectman Miller. Motion carries 3-0.

Selectman Miller stated he and Town Administrator Apple had attended the Coakley Landfill Group meeting and felt that they understand they are part of the solution of the management of the site. He further stated Town Administrator Apple has broken a lot of ice by attending the meetings, and that Attorney Bob Sullivan realizes the time has come to allow the public to be involved.

7. Report of the Town Administrator

7.1 General Report

In addition to the attached Town Administrator's report, Town Administrator Apple stated he would like to thank Georgia Dougherty for her 10 years of service to the town and wished her well in her future endeavors.
