Janos, Kathleen Kilgore, Larry Miller (Alternate), Phil Wilson (Alternate) **EXCUSED: Timothy Harned** ALSO PRESENT: Town Administrator Bryan Kaenrath **AGENDA** Chairman Pinette welcomed everyone to the September 19, 2019 Ethics Committee Meeting and called the meeting to order at 5:50 pm. **OLD BUSINESS** - None **NEW BUSINESS** Initial Review of Complaint Received September 10, 2019 Chairman Pinette asked if there were any recusals from the Board. Ms. Kilgore asked who Larry Miller was sitting in for and Chairman Pinette said Mr. Miller was sitting in for Ms. Kilgore and Mr. Wilson for Mr. Harned. Ms. Kilgore recused herself from the board and Mr. Wilson joined the Committee. The complaint was sent by Mr. Wally Kilgore to the Ethics Committee dated September 10, 2019, and Mr. Wilson read the complaint in full. The complaint alleged that during the Ethics Committee Meeting of August 26, 2019 four (4) members of the North Hampton Standing Ethics Committee engaged in unethical conduct while discussing the Ethics

Complaint filed by Mr. Joe Bernardo. It further alleged that the four (4) members repeatedly sullied Mr. Kilgore's reputation and failed to make it make it clear that the accusation was an alleged violation and their actions were in violation of the Code of Ethics.

Chairman Pinette said the members listed were himself, Mark Janos, Tim Harned, and Phil Wilson, and the Ethics Committee needed to decide whether to take jurisdiction over the matter. Town Administrator Kaenrath said a Committee-only confidential memo was also sent by Town Counsel on this case. Chairman Pinette said Town Counsel advised that no member listed needed to recuse himself from the next hearing.

Chairman Pinette said it seemed to be a complaint against and entire board about a meeting, and nothing in this complaint could be substantiated. He recommended that they not take jurisdiction and dismiss the complaint. Mr. Wilson agreed that he saw this as an attempt to disrupt the normal process of the Ethics Committee. Chairman Pinette added that accusing a whole board was actually an abuse of the system in place, and recommended they not take jurisdiction and move on to the next case.

Mr. Miller asked Mr. Janos if he felt compromised as a member of the Zoning Board, and Mr. Janos said he believed he would be able to act in a completely objective manner and did not act inappropriately as a Zoning Board member. He said he did not have a conflict of interest and agreed that this complaint should be dismissed.
