## HURRICANE LEE What to Expect

NORTH HAMPTON - North Hampton Fire & Rescue, North Hampton Police Department and North Hampton Emergency Management officials are tracking the incoming effects of Hurricane Lee.

This is what we can expect:

- → There will be NO DIRECT IMPACT to the New Hampshire Seacoast.
- → Outlying effects of the hurricane are expected Friday night into Saturday morning and expected to last throughout the day on Saturday.
- → The biggest impact region is the Gulf of Maine, with the NH Seacoast receiving some effects.
- → <u>PLAN FOR</u> tropical storm impacts as there's a large wind field with his storm.
- → Winds will be from the North, but no hurricane wind speeds.
- $\rightarrow$  Wind gust expected to be anywhere near 40-60mph.
- → <u>PLAN NOW FOR</u> scattered power outages.
- → The storm will occur during a favorable tide cycle, so flooding concerns are low.
- → Large ocean swells from 15' to 20'.
- → New Hampshire is currently out of the heavy rain threat; only  $\frac{1}{2}$ " to 1" of rainfall expected.
