This position will be covered under the police union's Collective Bargaining Agreement. Future salary and benefits for this position will be contained in the operating budget for subsequent years. Shall the Town of North Hampton vote that with respect to the ongoing development of the Morris Lamprey Conservation Easement that the decisions of the Conservation Commission and the Select Board be reversed and that the Conservation Commission and the Select Board shall cause the removal of structures, imported soil, sand, trees, septic system, artesian well, and restore the topographical state to conditions that existed at the time of Morris Lamprey's gift to the Town.
