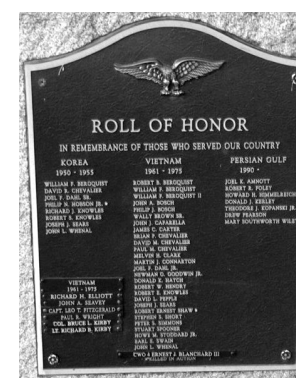

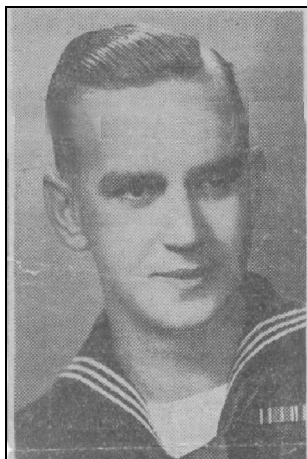

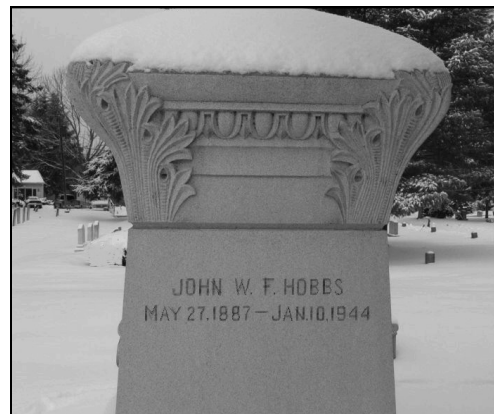
**Walnut Avenue & I-95**

Service: USNR ID: 2431645  
Enlisted: March, 1941  
Rank: SC2 Special Services/Communications  
Died: February 21, 1945, listed as “Still Serving on board the U.S.S. Bismarck Sea”, which sunk near Iwo Jima due to two Kamikaze planes igniting explosions of ammunition. The carrier sank within 90 minutes with 318 casualties.  
Memorialized: Honolulu, HI  
Awarded: Purple Heart



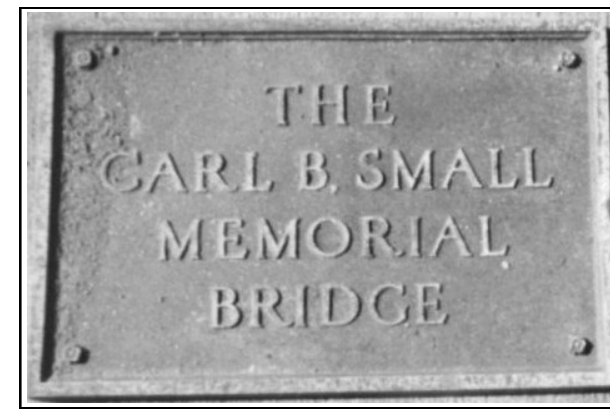

Died: January 10, 1944 in US due to surgical complications at age 56

Academy Board of Trustees: 1927-1935  
Note: John’s friends and family urged him not to reactivate his commission because he was over 50, but he strongly believed it was his duty to his country to serve.
